

CLERK: 27 Ayes, Mr. President

PRESIDENT: The E Clause is adopted. Now, are there other amendments to the bill.

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: I move that 611 as amended be advanced to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion now to advance LB611 as amended. All those in favor of the motion of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. So ordered, the bill is advanced.

SENATOR STULL: I move the E & R Amendments to 717 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion to adopt the E & R Amendments to LB-717. All those in favor of the motion say aye, those opposed say no. Amendments are adopted.

SENATOR STULL: Now, I move that 717 as amended, be advanced to E & R Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance 717 for Engrossment? All those in favor of advancing the bill please say aye, those opposed say no. The ayes have it. So ordered 717 as advanced. Thank you Senator Stull.

CLERK: Motion on the desk, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: I move that we accept no new bills from any source for a period of 10 days, signed Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Carpenter for his motion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, I have also asked the Clerk, on my own responsibility, to put somewhere on the podium the number of Legislative days remaining and also on the daily worksheets. Now it seems to me that we ought to, before we introduce any more bills, and I have no objection to that, use the next ten days in order to attempt to expedite the bills we've got up there. And that's the reason I make the motion for ten day... calendar days. We do not permit the introduction of any more bills until we have applied ourselves to the work that is already there to attempt to move it on. This is only a suggestion.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? Would the Clerk read the motion again, please?

CLERK: The motion is simply, Mr. President, I move to accept no new bills from any source for ten days.

PRESIDENT: Alright, is there any further discussion on that? Senator Barnett, do you want to be heard on the issue.

SENATOR BARNETT: Yes, Senator Carpenter yield to a question?
