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with no limits included in it. And I would think that would do substantially what he wants to do in talking in terms of the limits in 984. My amendment as I have written it, and I hope it is correct. Those would be the two sections that you would strike out just be edification. Now I'm perfectly willing to discuss this bill with amendments on Select File. But certainly if we are going to leave the limits in it, then I think it's time for an open discussion here. And again I will not prolong the body in terms of general objections to limitations. I would just say I would agree to that procedure once we strike the limitations out of the present Warner Bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask Senator Lewis a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis do you yield?

SENATOR LEWIS: Certainly.

SENATOR CARPENTER: To simplify your amendment you are requesting the body to adopt your amendment which would eliminate any limit on expenditure of public schools.

SENATOR LEWIS: That is correct.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: I want to make sure I understood Senator Lewis' response.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking him a question?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, I...

PRESIDENT: Will you yield, Senator Lewis?

SENATOR WARNER: Your response to Senator Carpenter's is that you wish to strike from the bill any reference to limitation.

SENATOR LEWIS: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Because what I would suggest that striking these two sections would not totally accomplish what you intent is and it would also create some other problems. So if..I have no objection to striking ref..general motion to striking the reference, because it takes more detail work.

SENATOR LEWIS: I realize the complications on this, too, but it's only with the understanding that the bill will be held on Select File until 984 which does have the limitations is disposed of one way or the other as far as the Legislature is concerned. And as far as I'm concerned I would abide by what ever happens to 984 as a provisions for 772, as far as the limitation is concerned.

SENATOR WARNER: I have no disagreement with you on the mechanics on how to achieve the objective and I certainly would agree that that fact if we can simply eliminate any mention of expenditure limitational school districts, I would accept that but....
