PRESIDENT: Let me interrupt here just a second. We are going to vote on a specific amendment, not on a thought. So get yourselves together there and have an amendment that works or vote on it just the way it is. Now I'm going to allow Senator Lewis to explain whether he wants to do it that way, or how he wants to do it.

SENATOR LEWIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, I certainly appreciate that generosity on your part. My intention and as I looked the bill it appeared to me that the major sections dealing with limitations would be 11 and 25. So subsequently that was the amendment. And at this point in time I will stay with that and if there are some mechanical problems I'll work them out between now and then. So I will just leave my motion the way it is.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: It's understood that Senator Lewis' intent which is the important thing is to strike the limitation of the expenditures of the public schools on the local level. It's understood if his amendment doesn't do that exactly he will bring in a revised amendment on Select File which I presume if his motion is passed which we will automatically accept. So we are voting on his amendment which says there's no limitations on what public schools on local
