

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: OK - I'll try this. Sale of any bicycle in violation of the provisions above shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person found guilty thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than - it ought to be more for the retailer, I don't know - not less than \$50.00 or more than \$100.00 - \$25.00 and \$100.00? Let's make it \$25.00 and \$100.00. Do you have that?

PRESIDENT: We'll wait for you to write it out.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Oh, you want me to write it out? OK.

CLERK: Reads amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: That isn't in final form, but that's what it would do. The amendment would make the sale of any bicycle not equipped, as the section requires, a misdemeanor and provide a penalty of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, do you want to respond to the amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would just like to express my support for his amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right. Is there any further -- Senator Simpson?

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, Members of the Legislature, I think we're getting probably to the right end of this rather than fining children. I would also suggest if we're concerned in this area, we would move the effective date of this act up to least January 1, 1975, and possibly, much sooner than that.

PRESIDENT: Now, the Chair didn't hear an amendment or a motion to that - that Senator Simpson is making a suggestion that we move the effective date of this up. Is there any further discussion now of Senator Cavanaugh's amendment - any further discussion? Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Cavanaugh - could I ask Senator Cavanaugh a question?

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Yes.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Cavanaugh, this is for new bicycles sold, but what about tires that will be sold for bicycles? Do you think we ought to have the same provision for them in the years to come?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: What does it say about tires?

SENATOR KEYES: Well, aren't we talking about that yellow - that red strip around the tires - and that should be - that no tires should be allowed to be sold in the state after so long unless they have that strip around them.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: It would include any violation of the things above. Why - are you going to add something above?

SENATOR KEYES: What was that? I didn't get what you said?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Are you going to add something above to the original section?

SENATOR KEYES: Oh no - no, I just wanted to make certain that all tires that are sold for bicycles, like I have in my garage, that
