PRESIDENT: We are now ready and we'll vote on the kill motion. This takes the simple majority on LB434. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, Madame President.

PRESIDENT: LB434 is indefinitely postponed.

CLERK: Madame President LB685. LB685 it's a bill introduced by Senator Carpenter, Chairman of the Executive Board. A Bill For An Act relating to energy crisis emergency situations. To provide powers to the Governor to create a committee to provide duties and to declare an emergency. There are committee amendments by Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask that the bill be passed over until Monday the 11th. The reason being that I have to catch a plane. In the discussion of this bill I want to alert the Republican Candidates for State and National Office that I hope after what I say on Monday they will stand on their feet and tell this body and the world whether they support the President of the United States or whether they don't. Because we are going to bring up this thing that's happened and which this state was belittled by the Congressional Delegation and the National Republican Chairman. I just want to give you some ideas so that those who might become involved will not get shot flat-footed. This could be a discussion of great merit and interest.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter is asking unanimous consent, is there any objection? If not, this will be held over until Monday.

CLERK: LB697 introduced by Senator Fowler of the 27th District A Bill For An Act to adopt the Interstate Corrections Compact. Madame President, there are amendments by Senator Luedtke's Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Madame President, I move the adoption of the committee amendments to LB697.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Madame President, the committee amendments were necessary,, were made necessary because of...we must comply with the administrative due process requirements with regard to ratification of any kind of a...any kind of some kind of parole is ratification. We must comply with due process. This particular amendment deals with the correction on due process and also takes care of a couple of technical amendments in the first part. It adds Article 11 which is the due process part.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? All those in favor vote...all those in favor say aye, opposed the same. The amendments are adopted. Do you have further amendments? Senator Fowler.
