

the bill be introduced. All those in favor vote aye, All those opposed vote no. Will the Clerk read the title.

CLERK: The title really doesn't say what it does do. It says that it relates to the Supreme Court to provide for re-districting.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I didn't sign either one of these bills because I am opposed to one of them. However, I did vote to introduce them because we might as well get the question before the body. I imagine that it might be sent to my committee but one of them is a residential thing. Now it is required in the constitution that the judge must live in Lincoln where he is not really from Lincoln and if he doesn't want to live in Lincoln, I think that this is the one that allows him not to live in Lincoln if he doesn't want too. He carries on his work here but just like the legislature, if he wants to commute, let him commute. I...this...is this the one we are on now Senator Anderson? This one is alright merely takes out of the constitution that he has to live in Lincoln.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I have reservations about it but I would let it go under pressure from my good friend Senator Fellman, I would let him introduce his bill.

PRESIDENT: Thank you Senator Syas. I know that I say thank you on behalf of Senator Fellman likewise. Senator Fellman for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR FELLMAN: It is not often that my good friend from North Omaha gives me a compliment publicly like that I thought that it was only done privately. I would like to get one more vote up there so that this bill could be introduced. This is not a controversial bill.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced, does the Clerk want to read the title?

CLERK: Well I have some more Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Read A...a.....

CLERK: Read.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, this bill has a purpose of giving to the public service commission additional authority beyond which they now have. What I would like to do is have the committee have a hearing in order to have these truckers come and find some method by which may help them. I move for the introduction of the bill.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Senator Dickinson.
