SENATOR NORE: Now this only applies to public energys?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: And also private, yes.

SENATOR NORE: Also private. So if I put a..say if I have a stoker and I put a filter in my chimney, that would not be a..

SNEATOR HASEBROOCK: No, this is exempt the..I mean you can't get the sales tax exemption from that. Unless you were an industry. If you are an industry that is different. Private industry you can, but if you are an individual you cannot.

SENATOR NORE: If I'm running a grocery store and I put a filter on my air conditioner, is that exempt?

SENATOR HASEBROOCK: No, that won't, that will not be under this bill. You will pay taxes on this.

PRESIDENT: Now, is there any further discussion of LB 640? All right, Senator Hasebroock has the motion then to advance LB 640 from General File to E & R Initial. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, all those opposed vote no. You are voting on the advancement of LB 640 from General File to E & R initial, all those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Have you all voted that are going to vote? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. We can move on to the General File consideration then of LB 293.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 293 has been considered at various times and first considered on January 22, again considered on January 30, the bill has been laid over. The committee amendments have been adopted. Various amendments by Senator Simpson have been adopted. Various unidentified amendments have been adopted. More amendments have been adopted that have no name on them.

PRESIDENT: Stand by Senator Goodrich.

CLERK: Then, Mr. President, Senator Mahoney had an amendment which and which was adopted. There is now pending amendments which are offered by Senator Goodrich which appear on page 512 of the Legislative Journal. O.K. Mr. President, the Goodrich amendments appear on page 512 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: All right. LB 293 is fairly well amended and there are further amendments proposed now. Senator Goodrich back to you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body. 293 as you will recall the other day. We put on 6 different amendments on the bill and after we got done with those amendments we had a considerably lengthy conference with the representatives of the Legal Aid Society in behalf of the tenants side of the bill. And the Attorneys for the landlords. This is what we sometimes refer to as the Cavanaugh-Goodrich conference in the rotunda out here. Anyhow in that conference we arrived at a solution where both sides would accept the bill and the amendments that you see on page 512 in your Journal are those amendments that we adopt right now and both sides are ready to accept and live with bill. I would move for the adoption of these amendments.
