through the designating of the block. Now there is plenty of money which is part of the budget bill you I assume supported the funding of money before. The money that is indicated there is \$105,000 is the request for additional planning money which has nothing to do with the bill specifically I believe the Governor's recommendation is for \$20,000 for planning. I do not believe the Budget Committee has yet considered capital construction. If you have I am not aware of it. So whatever amount would be used there would be approved there would be the proper place. All the bill does is preserves that area for a building should a future session of the Legislature appropriate money to do so. That's all it does.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney, the Chair additionally would respond that the last line is unusual in this particular bill and I'm not sure that this would relate to all other public buildings that the State might have, but I would call your attention to line 9, the Society is hereby authorized to accept public and private funds for the purpose of constructing such a building. Now, I wonder the construction of that language, the Chair would observe, only observe that it would be exceptionally difficult to write out some sort of a fiscal note estimating fiscal impact on that when we don't know what public funds or private funds might be available for construction of such a building. If that helped any.

SENATOR WHITNEY: It doesn't help at all because it has nothing to do with ..because in the first line says that if the Nebraska State Historical Society shall be responsible for the development of plans. And I was under the impression that if there was a fiscal note in the bill then you had to have an aid bill. Providing it cost more than \$5,000.

PRESIDENT: Senator Skardadid you want to be heard on the issue? I would remind the body we are still on Final Reading. Senator Skarda are you passing.

SENATOR SKARDA: I would just like to have a senator of Senator Warner. And ask him does this first indication he's had from Senator Stahmer that there was some opposition to this piece of Legislation. That's the only interest I have.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, do you care to respond?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Senator Skarda I was not aware of it. Anything of it until right now.

PRESIDENT: All right, now the motion before the body is just to bracket the bill for a week. Are there objections to bracketing the bill? For a week. There are objections? All right, then Senator Stahmer do you want to restate your motion? There are objections, unanimous consent isn't possible.

SENATOR STAHMER: I move to bracket the bill for a week.

PRESIDENT: The motion now is, shall is..the question is, shall the bill be bracketed for a week on Final Reading. All those in favor of bracketing the bill will vote aye, all those opposed will vote no. The motion would require the chair rule of 25 votes in order to bind the body to that particular action. Once again have you all voted? Senator Whitney, Mr. Ehrlich is trying to get your attention there. Senator Whitney. Oh. Now then, there have you all voted. Clerk will record.
