

or form a needed primary. This primary will be conducted if there are more than two candidates and the Attorney General says that the write in and the petition candidates will be totally eligible in this form.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore?

SENATOR NORE: I visited with Mr. Moser, the Attorney General's office, and he said that it was a matter of policy, now do you want to have a primary, do you want to expose these people to the public before the final election or don't you want to expose them? I personally, I think that the school administrator's maneuver to try to in some area to try to elect their own school board and that is not good.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, the motion is to bracket the bill on Final Reading. Let's confine the remarks to bracketing the bill.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Well Mr. Chairman, I would oppose of bracketing the bill on the basis of two things. Number 1 to elevate a problem which I thought was unfair system of having no general election and primary. I asked that we work in terms of getting this bill introduced. Senator Murphy

who had some concerns about school boards having to have elections where it was not contested made the objection on the floor and the amendment came from Senator Murphy and no one else and I think it's a fair way to handle it where you do not have a contested way. We're going to have a much fairer system under what the provisions of 592, if it passes, than we have now where you have 11 or 12 people running at one-time shot. I think the bill is fair, I think we might as well either vote it up or down now.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the motion to bracket the bill? Senator Nore back to you. Senator Nore then is now closing on his motion to bracket the bill.

SENATOR NORE: I would like to ask Senator Lewis a question? Frank Lewis, would you say that there is only one candidate for the Legislature, so his name should be put on the primary?

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: I certainly do, that happens from time to time.

SENATOR NORE: What's the difference between that and the school board.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Well, Senator Nore, there is one name on the primary you've got a pretty good idea who the winner is going to be. And if there's two names on the school board, I have a pretty good idea who the winners are going to be. Now, if you want to print ballots and if you want to run them...

SENATOR NORE: Well, we have a lot of Districts sometimes that only have one candidate for the Unicameral. Now, should we take... shall we expose that person to the public or not keep him unexposed until the Final Election?

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: You mean by writing his name in, that exposes him?
