PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer, do you want to respond?

SENATOR STAHMER: I'd like to respond by saying, first of all I think Senator Marvel is a terrific Chairman and I think he's a great gentleman and I've enjoyed serving with him for four years and I make no reservations when I say that. I can only state that I have received a notice yesterday about a bill to hear state colleges. There was no mention made to me at any time that we were going to be considering that bill. Had there been some notification, I would have said to hell with the Judiciary Committee, I'll stay and straighten out that bill. But I had no notification. I come back...and bang...the bill is gone. But I still will say till my dying breath Senator Marvel is a great Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator Stahmer. Now, Senator Warner, the Chair I think is would entertain a motion that we ask unanimous consent to print those amendments in the journal and that looks like at least that would put 984 in shape for discussion tomorrow. Did I hear such a motion? Senator Warner?

SENATOR WARNER: I think Senator Carpenter has made the motion and I second it.

PRESIDENT: O.K. thank you.

SENATOR WARNER: I would only want to report this that I am, for those who would want a copy before noon, I am having some of the amendments reproduced and they will be available to those who want it and for Senator Stahmer, Senator Stahmer, Dave, the amendments as proposed take care of 403 totally so but I will get a copy to you in just a moment.

PRESIDENT: Now then Senator Carpenter is asking unanimous consent to print the amendments to 984 so that we can discuss it tomorrow at the head of General File, now are there objections to printing the amendments? Hearing none, so ordered they will be done. 984 will be heard after 327 tomorrow on General File on debate. Now then any other motions on the desk? Well just clear on the desk here because we are getting ready for General File.

CLERK: I move that the non controversial bills be considered on Friday, February 15 with the understanding that there is an objection to such consideration, the presiding officer will immediately pass over the bill. Signed Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, obviously I was going to consult with the Speaker, who has been excused, and I didn't see him while he was here. He and I are completely blank and I would think that we ought to get something over there so that the people downstairs and around here who have that responsibility will not run out of work. What the motion means and all it means is that we start at the head of General File, if there develops a controversy which means a large discussion, the Chair automatically will pass the bill over and go to the next one. That is exactly what it does. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of the motion? Do you all understand the motion? The question is then, shall the motion be adopted and that would be then to take up non controversial bills Friday, with the Chair able to overrule if there is any controversy involving anyone of them and anyone objects. All those in favor of the motions vote aye, all those opposed, excuse me Senator Nore, did you want to be heard?
