getting into a highly sensitive area. Nobody likes to be audited. And I'm no exception. But we have the responsibility on the State Government to see that those who spend the money we allocate to them comply with the intent. And the intent is so broad that because for the most part it is blank checks. We allow them and give them too much leeway to do what maybe they shouldn't do, plus we don't do anything to even to determine what they have done in the broad sense. Now I would ask Senator Marvel that if he will direct the Fiscal Staff in order to bring an amendment so that this line 20, is all included to see that it spells out, not only in a broad sense, but an individual who he is supposed to audit and how often. And if you are going to buy that then you have to appropriate the money for him to do it. And this is the weakness of state government. When we appropriated bills into thin air. Nobody knows about anything except those who spend it. And they are not concerned except to the extent that they are satisfied themselves. And again let me repeat, again, this body can earmark anything it wants to within a reasonable limitation to require the men to do whatever you have an interest in. If we do that we will have no complaint. If those who spend this money are not responsible to this body, because we have to be responded to. And I believe they ought come hand in hand, to this great body of people who want to do the right thing collectively, and they ought know what we want them to do. Now the Governor, for example, is the administrator, he's just the administrator. Nothing else. He does what we tell him to do, and in the expenditure of money. And if we don't tell him how we want to spend it, he spends it how he wants to spend it. That human nature. I don't complain about that. I only complain in the area in which we have an interest, we don't earmark so he or no one else can do any different. This DS is a complete mess. Not from the standpoint that it's operation mechanically, but otherwise. They are spending money because we permit it in a revolving fund which the Attorney General said they shouldn't have, probably. And the cash fund, but they are doing it anyway. Now before this bill gets through I propose another amendment to see that the Governor will receive an ample sufficient amount of money, to employ whoever he wants to in his own area of responsibility and not take off from the DS or those people who don't belong in his employment under him as the Governor of this state. And all we've done, we've made an elastic appropriation, we've allowed them to do whatever they want to do, and they were able to use the surplus to anyway they want and by that way they circumsised..that's probably a better word. (laughter) Maybe it should be that it would be more painful to us. Particularly at my age. But you know what I'm talking about, we need responsibility in this thing, and we are not getting it. And I apologize because neither used the right word on this text which might not be..but everybody knows what it is, so what harm it this.
