SENATOR F. CARSTENS: I'll yield to Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (mike not activated) leader. He doesn't understand what I am trying to do and I presume that this is not the first time nor the last. All I am saying is that I want to prevent the Governor of this state from doing by indirection what he is not willing to do by direction. This Legislature gave the DAS the authority to create revolving funds, without limitation or as to how they would be applied. It is my humble judgment that they apply more than necessary in order to give them a greater appropriation than what this body gave to them. That I think should not be allowed to continue. Now I think that I am as friendly to the Governor as I should be at least, or will be anyway. I think that what I do is to help the state as well as him. Often we are in disagreement. Senator Barnett and Senator Mahoney misunderstood what I am trying to do. I just think that he ought to do by direction and take the responsibility for it and not do it by indirection. I went to the Supreme Court of the State of Nebraska on my own initiative and try to get them to try and take this case and the court would not do it as an original entry so I forgot about it. I haven't forgot about it now because this is the place to correct it. All I am saying is give the Governor a enough money for him to hire whoever he wants to in his own personal staff and not divert them from some other agency which bills those that have no control over the billing and use that to get him additional staff members. He ought to have as big a staff as we have got, that is all it does, you can't read anything else into it. That is all that it means.
