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in Washington under the FCT appointed thirty attorneys to begin an investigation of the energy crisis. Now, we had no oil men, we had no electrical people, we had none of the people who act in the field but we did have a staff of thirty attorneys to begin to investigate the petroleum business. This is where we are going in this consumer protective business. And, the Federal Bureau on advertising after two years came up with four actual violations. And, this particular article I refer to makes the comment that unless they can do better, perhaps it will have the good judgment to bend itself to other pursuits and stop running. A make work program for lawyers. In the final analysis, consumers will make up their own minds on whether they get what they are seeking in the products they buy. While their decisions may not always be wholly rational, different folks have different tastes. Consumers to the contrary, it is quite possible that the broad public has been less snowed than the Consumers Protective Bureau.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, I think he thought he was closing but he was not closing. The motion was to cease debate, it failed. If there is any further discussion, Senator Waldron, has his light on. You will still be given another opportunity to close, Senator Murphy. Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: I will, I would like to say a couple of things and then I'll sit down because I think it's been discussed here. But I will say that I apologize to Senator Murphy, that I have neglected in the last draft and have left out willfully violates this act and, of course, that was supposed to be in there and it was in one of the other drafts and checking Section 14, it has been an oversight and I will insert that once it gets on Select File with another few minor technical difficulties. I want to point out to the Body once again that this, Senator Murphy's amendment, we must kill that amendment. If you think the consumers deserve any protection in the State of Nebraska. That amendment provides no protection whatsoever so if you believe the present system is good enough in Nebraska, then vote for the Murphy amendment. If you believe we must improve upon the present system in the State of Nebraska for the consumer, then you should vote down the Murphy amendment and then vote for my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion before Senator Murphy closes? Senator Nore. Senator Nore, you've talked several times. I hope you keep it brief.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members. I...for you folks who are in business, I think the seller needs a little protection too. I have a feeling that the seller gets abused more than the buyer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy is closing.

SENATOR MURPHY: There is substantially little difference between Senator Waldron's intended amendment and the amendment that I have. Several of the omissions that are not in his bill have been included in this bill. It provides additional consumer protection. The statement, if you want, if you think the consumer is adequately protected, vote for mine. This is an unfortunate statement. This bill, if you will look at it, provides additional protection where it belongs in the statutes of Nebraska, not in a whole new code. I will not belabor it further. I move the adoption of my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy has closed. His amendment is to strike the Waldron amendment and substitute the Murphy amendment. All those in favor of Senator Murphy's amendment vote aye, those opposed, vote no. It requires a majority of those voting. Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Record vote has been requested.

CLERK: Record vote read. 23 ayes, 16 nays, 10 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Murphy amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments to the bill? The Murphy amendment struck the Waldron amendment
