We can vote again but I don't see any purpose. Senator Waldron agrees, the Murphy amendment is adopted which deletes the Waldron amendment. Any further amendments? Senator Waldron.

CLERK: No further amendments.

SENATOR WALDRON: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to add Senator Murphys name to the bill and delete my name.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, do you have any objection to that?

SENATOR MURPHY: Not if the Senator has that sentiment. I'm sure he has worked long and hard on it and it is an improvement on the consumer practice but if that's his feeling, I certainly have no objection.

PRESIDENT: There's no objection so his name is added.

CLERK: And Senator Waldron's is deleted?

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron asked for the deletion of his name, yes. Are there any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron.

SENATOR WALDRON: I move the bill be advanced to E & R.....
