CLERK: 26 ayes on motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB790 is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, I think Senator Chambers needs recognizing?

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, on the last bill LB811 that I explained, the explanation was correct but the number of the amendments was incorrect so I ask unanimous consent to switch and adopt the ones which should have been adopted and reject the one that should have been rejected. We read a number that would start the amendment and so I have to have unanimous consent to allow the clerk to make the substitution.

PRESIDENT: All right, are there objections to the substitution as explained by Senator Chambers on LB811? There was a mistaken identity. Are there any objections? Hearing none, so ordered. It will be done. All right.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have one more bill on our list. We do have a motion to adjourn.

PRESIDENT: Let's try the LB721.

CLERK: Read LB721. There are no committee amendments, other amendments nor nothing attached to this bill.

PRESIDENT: Very good. Senator Wiltse.

SENATOR WILTSE: Mr. Chairman, this bill's correction from L140 which deals to the ability of banks to make loans to their active officers or employees. The original intent of the section was to provide a bank employee the opportunity to obtain a modest loan for personal use. Formerly we provided that an individual could get a \$25,000 loan for the purpose of a home but we did not provide for personal loans. This is adding the privilege of the individual bank to loan to its officers and to prevent their having to go to competitive banks in order to make a personal loan. A total loan of \$30,000, purely a corrective bill.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion of LB721. Then, the question is shall LB721 be advanced from General File to E & R initial. All those in favor of advancing the bill, please vote aye. All those opposed, vote no. Voting on the advancement of LB721. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, unanimous consent to print some stuff in the Journal, signed Frank Lewis. Mr. President, I move that we adjourn to Monday, February 18, signed, Senator Hasebroock.
