

killed in Judiciary Committee, and I asked it be raised and placed on General File along with LB 354. But members of the Judiciary Committee, as I understand it, and if I'm wrong, I'll be glad to be corrected. Felt that it would not be very proper for them to be sponsoring a bill which had completely changing our Probated Administration Law and at the same time also vote out of committee LB 755. Now what I propose to do without going into the merits of either bill, is that if 755 can be raised on the floor, that 755 and 354 will be heard together at the time one and or the other is taken up, we will take up both of them. Dispose of both of them at the same time. These are highly important bills and very likely, I think especially LB 354 is without a question probably one of the most important and comprehensive bills, and probably one of the most complicated bills which has been before this Legislature in the last 25 or 50 years. And these bills are important and should be given proper consideration. I feel that they should be taken together, heard together, and disposed of by this Legislature, in one way or the other. And I therefore make the move that LB 755 be placed on General File and with LB 354 not...be placed on General File and notwithstanding the action of the committee.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion now of the motion? Any further discussion? Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Was this bill in Judiciary, Senator Carstens. Would you...

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes, it was in the Judiciary Committee.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well I'm not..I think I'd like to hear from Senator Luedtke as to why he might of..whether he does object or why he might and why he would object.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR Luedtke: Well, Mr. President, in answer to Senator Cavanaugh. I can concur on what Senator Carstens said. It was absolutely impossible for the committee to go along with the piece meal amendment to the probate laws when we had put forth so much effort on a comprehensive bill, such as LB 354, which as Senator Carstens says, it's probably one of the most important bills that has come berfore this body in years and years. It does completely redo Probate, Estate, Guardianship, Serviceship Laws in the State of Nebraska. Now, LB 755 was what SENator Carstens introduced is a bill which does a piece meal job of attempting to patch up some of the objections made to our present Probate Laws. The Judiciary Committee took the position that we did not want to just have a patch quilt situation we wanted to treat it as an entire problem with a comprehensive bill 354. I do believe, that Senator Carstens is correct. That if this body wants to revive 755, that the proper procedure would be to follow his advice and that is to put it on General File along with 354, so that we do not waste the time of this body of debating the same subject two times. In other words, it's the same subject matter, we would debate it all at the same time, and then we could take what appropriate action this body wants to take.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Luedtke, would you say that 755 is an alternative of legitimate alternative to 554, 354 or whatever.
