SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, if Senator Lewis has no objections, why don't he pass over the bill with the understanding that it will be the first order of business on General File tomorrow in order to give Senator Burbach and I and Senator Lewis a chance to better understand at least the form of the amendment. Would Senator Lewis object?

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, do you object?

SENATOR LEWIS: That is fine.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would concur in that that we actually still have some other business going on here. We have some confusion on another bill here. It is a little bit of the problem here. Are there objections to laying the bill over until tomorrow? Senator Nore, do you object to laying the bill over until tomorrow?

SENATOR NORE: Temporarily yes. I would like to have the amendment put in my book. I don't see them. Now when you throw them on my desk here it is like throwing a needle in a haystack. There are so many of them that you can't find them. I would request that they be put in the book so that we can find out what they are.

PRESIDENT: Your request relates to what amendment Senator Nore?

SENATOR NORE: The amendments to 597. They are not in my book.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Nore is asking that all the amendments be put in the books in order to consider 597 and the request is and I assume that he has now withdrawn his objection placing 597 for discussion for tomorrow. Are there objections to that? Hearing none, so ordered. 597 will be passed over today and it will go as the first order of business for tomorrow. When we get to General File. Senator Nore.
