

and amendments on any piece of legislation supposed on this floor instead of making exceptions as far as individuals are concerned, and I object.

PRESIDENT: Very good, now Senator Nore, stand by Senator Dickinson. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Dickinson a question if he would yield. What is your, your opposition to what we did last Friday is the name of the college?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Simply, at this moment, I am opposing an amendment being adopted by this body as a committee amendment that was not in fact adopted at an executive session of the committee. Now if the Chair that a committee can adopt an amendment without have or having an executive session and doing it officially with the knowledge of all members, then I will accept that decision of the chair. Now, if he in fact agrees with me, I'm only asking that it go back in its original form and take it from there. In response, may I Mr. President to Senator Skarda. I'm not asking that anything be undone at this point, if it were done legitimately. He mentioned the committee amendment. That is my whole point, it was not a committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, obviously enough the Chair would not be in a position of calling something an official action of the body which it was not, so I could not rule that way if those are the facts. Actually what you are objecting to is that an amendment was apparently adopted to this bill that flew under the colors of a committee amendment?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Right, yes sir.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Skarda, back to you.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, I'm going to ask the Senator what he proposes as an alternative of the word metro and what concerns him so much with the word metro and that is what I want to know? What is his intent and what is his desires and what is he going to do? What is bothering him? What is his request for bringing the bill back pertain too?

PRESIDENT: The Chair would observe that apparently the fact that an amendment was put on the bill Senator Skarda, that apparently an amendment went on the bill that flew under the colors of an a...a..committee amendment, and apparently it was not.

SENATOR SKARDA: I understand that Mr. President, but that is not answering my question. I...that is not the question that I directed to Senator Dickinson. I want to know why.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: I'm simply asking Senator Skarda that the amendment that the committee adopted, be placed on it and that if the bill goes back to General File, the amendments will then be put in a book and you will have an opportunity to read it and see what is said and what is offered and see what we adopted.
