SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I can understand the ticklish position that the chair is in, especially in view of Senator Duis' correct observations about what should be debated and what should not be debated. We have ranged a bit far for our field this morning and before the gavel can fall I'm going to say that we ought to kill the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STAHMER: I just have one question of Senator Moylan. Did you say that you showed some slides to the committee which demonstrated how these wheels went around?

SENATOR MOYLAN: Now that is a touchy question today, isn't it. No, I did not show the slides because I told the motor vehicle department that we don't want to continue this hearing too long, so I did not have too. But I would say that if you go down there they will be glad to show them to you, or would be glad to show them to anyone.

SENATOR STAHMER: I'm alright on slides.

SENATOR Moylan; Exactly how this will....

PRESIDENT: Alright gentlemen.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion to move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Right, the previous question has been called, does the Chair see five hands? Thank you. The question is shall the debate now close? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. You are voting to close debate. Thank you, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: Motion to close debate carries. Would you believe that there were no more lights on and nobody wanted to speak anyway. Senator Moylan do you want to close on your motion to return the bill. No closing. The question is shall LB827 be returned to Select File for a specific amendment, that would be to clarify the penalty section. All those in favor of returning the bill vote aye, those opposed vote no. This motion takes 25 votes in order to return the bill. Once again the Chair would inquire if you have all voted? Have you all now voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 17 nays.

PRESIDENT: Would you believe that 827 is returned to Select File. Now, do we have any resolutions on the desk? Does that clean up Final Reading.

CLERK: None Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Sergeant at arms can take down the ropes back there, wait a minute before we begin that the Chair does have a couple of announcements. I think that we should take care of. We have some Royalty visiting us this morning. I am pleased to announce that we have Miss Sheryl Burkhard who is the present National Honey Queen. She is a past Arbor Day Centennial Queen, she is the past Nebraska Honey Queen, her partents are Mr. & Mrs. Ralph Burkhardt, her grandparents are Mr. & Mrs. Henry Puppe, they are from Nebraska City and they are seated under the north balcony.
