

PRESIDENT: NO, it isn't necessary.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Thank you I'll leave it lay for a day.

PRESIDENT: Can't change it anyway, we had announced the vote. Now, do we does the Chair understand that we have a bill for introduction?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Carpenter asked to take LB772 on Select.

PRESIDENT: That is correct. Back to Senator Carpenter on your motion of 772.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President, there is an amendment I guess there are amendments on the Clerk's desk pertaining to LB772 which is the state aid to local public schools. I think that some of us are ready to take up the amendments that are there. I think that it is highly important that we make a determination and somewhat in its final form so that we can at least move it over to E & R and hold it because I understand that it is desirable to that 984 moves ahead of 772. But I think now is the proper time to get 772 in somewhat of a final form so that we would not be delayed at a later time while we are trying to do that.

PRESIDENT: Did the Chair hear your motion for unanimous consent to unbracket the bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, I ask unanimous consent to unbracket the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner do you object? He is asking unanimous consent to unbracket 772. Do you object?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I 'll object long enough to ask a question or two. First I would report to the members that the budget staff, the run that some or several of you at least requested on the impact of the different formulas that are available or will be available by late this afternoon, which many of you wanted to see what the impact of some of these alternatives were. If you want that information before you consider changes I call that point to your attention. I think secondly I have no idea as to what the amendments are that are being that are up there, so I guess that I would inquire of Senator Carpenter what are the nature of them.

SENATOR CARPPENTER: Let me ask a question of...number one number two, it is my understanding that the amendments that are offered by Senator Duis you are in agreement with.

SENATOR WARNER: No.

SENATOR CARPENTER: They are the amendments that you and he talked about and when I was there you said that you would agree to them.

SENATOR WARNER: No Senator Carpenter, If you were there, Herb was there, and I know exactly what I said. I made the offer at that point, that I pointed out to Senator Duis and to you that there were serious problems with the amendment that you put on for Senator Duis the other day and that the two bills are drafted differently and did not match and then
