

I said to you that either we have to take that off and or Senator Duis wanted to try and move and put the whole his whole bill 958 that would be fine, or else we would have to redraft the whole bill. At that time both you and Senator Duis said no, no, you did not want to put his whole bill into 772, you directed both of you agreed as I understood you that it or I should have a proper amendment drawn for 772 which would split 50-50 between equalization and foundation. This I did, and these are also on that computer run-out that will be available to the members to see.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Duis, the Chair would observe that we are still debating and discussing something that hasn't even been unbracketed. Now, what is your pleasure Senator Duis, it hasn't been unbracketed, I don't see how we can discuss it.

SENATOR DUIS: Alright, then I won't discuss it except that I would have to discuss it I presume, with Senator Warner because the amendment that I have up there is exactly what we said we were going to do and that is to put the entire bill in there so that there were no more mechanical problems. I will forego any formal debate on it beings it has not been unbracketed. The motion is to unbracket.

PRESIDENT: Stand by just a minute. Senator Warner, are you withdrawing your objection then to unbracketing the bill?

SENATOR WARNER: No.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner is objecting then. Fine, the unanimous consent. Senator Carpenter, do you want to move to unbracket the bill?

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, I won't if he wants to be a dog in the manger, we had an agreement, and he understood it. But not....you.....

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, Senator Warner, go ahead.

SENATOR WARNER: No.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, do you withdraw your motion then entirely.

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, he objected to it, that is good enough for me.

PRESIDENT: Fine, that closes the issue then. There is no motion before the body. Senator Kime then, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR KIME: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, my bill 646, was bracketed for yesterday, but we didn't get to it. It was automatically to come up first this morning, 646.

PRESIDENT: That is fine, we are not there yet Senator, our problem is that we can't get off of Select File here. There is an adgenda that we have to follow every day and that is what I am trying to get too here. Now Senator Frank Lewis for what purpose do you rise.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Just wait till we get over.
