understand that one house in the State of Kansas still has to act on the bill but all the surrounding states have passed this legislation and I could give you a few other figures as to the amount of funds that we could possibly lose if we fail to pass this particular bill or one like it. So, unless there are other questions, I move that the bill be advanced to E & R as amended.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion? If not, the motion is to advance LB873. All those in favor, vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. It takes 25 votes voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Clerk shall record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, one nay, 14 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I would ask unanimous consent that the bill be expedited. We do have to have this thing across the board by the 3rd day of March as I understand it.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection to expediting the bill? If not, so ordered. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. Now that this bill is advanced, I wish to say that I'm afraid that probably in the course of this bill, a real good study wasn't made on it. I think that we will find that this bill is unconstitutional at the present state and I'm having an amendment drawn which I will propose on Select File and I hope you will seriously consider it. Because when the amendment gets here, I'll have to have it prepared and put in the Journal. One of the reasons that I had in withdrawing LB605 is because I did consult with the Attorney General's office. I appears as though we cannot delegate authority to the Governor of the State of Nebraska to set a speed limit in lieu of the fact that there is a penalty involved. And it has to be very specific when we delegate this authority to him and this particular bill does it with the amendment, I do not believe. So consequently there's an amendment being drawn that I think will make the bill constitutional so that it will be operatable and we won't be in jeopardy. I'm sure sorry that the Governor's staff didn't get busy and get down to brass tacks on this to find out about the constitutionality of it. I've studied it quite thoroughly and I think that the amendment they brought in, and I think probably this was to combat my bill, the reason they put it on and I'm sorry they did it this way because I feel this might have made the bill unconstitutional and I'm not so sure but what the original bill itself was not unconstitutional because of delegation of authority. But they are setting, studying it right now and I'm in hopes that I'll have the amendment ready and I will propose the amendment on Select File, Senator Kremer, with your permission. I do want this to be constitutional and I thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Thank you for your words of wisdom, Senator Duis. Now the next bill up is LB605 and do you have a motion on this?

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I think I will delay my motion on this because I think maybe we'd better hang this one back up there if you don't mind and bracket it up there in case something goes wrong with this other bill that we might have to amend it to the place....and I'm not doing this in other way, Senator Kremer....I hope that you will agree with me. I will ask
