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they have a motel, they like to have a place where they can have liquor by the drink. And it's my understanding of this bill that this would prevent that. Also, you may have in a sparsely settled county, you may have towns around the outside edges of that county. And their trade territory may be other counties. And this will hurt them. Now the thing is that there are more places, retail outlets in these counties than is permitted in this bill. Senator Simpson has a bill on this subject. My own feeling is that this particular section #7, in this bill is not germane in this bill because it has more than one subject in the bill in my judgement. And I would prefer that Senator Simpson's bill come along, rather than to put his bill into this bill. So I am moving that this Section 7 be stricken. This will then let the laws of supply and demand take care to considerably greater extent the number of these retail outlets, rather than to have a law which say you can only have one outlet for every one thousand people.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Object to the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any other discussion on the amendments? If not are you ready to vote, Senator Whitney. All those in favor of the Whitney motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. Amendments adopted. Any other amendments?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President there is another amendment on..offered by Frank Lewis. This would in Section 9, after the line 1, it says...

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis wants it held. If there is no objection we will pass over that amendment. Any other amendments?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly, do you wish to be recognized? O.K.

CLERK: Wait a minute. We now have another amendment. By Senator Goodrich, to amend 616 by striking section 8 and all other requirements that call for transportation charges.

PRESIDENT: Read the amendment again.

CLERK: By striking section 8 of the Carpenter amendment and any other reference that would call for transportation charges.

PRESIDENT: Do you move the adoption of your amendment, Senator Goodrich?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Is there a second. O.K. It's been moved and seconded. The Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. Now what my understanding of this section 8 of the Carpenter amendment is..or calls for rather. And this is also included in the committee amendments, and the Cavanaugh amendments. The section calls for a minimum \$1.50 charge for each carton that is delivered to any retailer from a wholesaler. The proceeds of this \$1.50 go to the wholesaler. What I'm saying is, that in the Omaha area for example, we pay approximately 45¢ per carton. This is adding in the neighborhood of \$1.05 per carton to the transportation charges of each carton in Omaha. I am opposed to that, and that's the part that I want
