PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, let me ask Senator Dickinson a question. Technically, the Senator is right. That was the agreement. Would you have any objections to moving the bill to Select File, so at that the time the Legislature as I understand your position, you would like to have us all here in order to better understand this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson will you yield?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Do you have any objections Senator because I understand your objection you prefer that everybody be here in order to better understand the bill. When it gets to Select File you will be in the same position then to bring up any discussion you might want to do. And it probably would preclude Senator Luedtke from again making another explanation of the same bill. I don't think you would loose your position.

SENATOR DICKINSON: I'll accept that Senator Carpenter. May I respond to Senator Chambers. I agree with you Senator Chambers that possibly we should object to me when the bill comes up or not force the introducer to go through the explanation, but in some instances you don't..you try to listen and decide what's being said and your objection then comes out and that's when you have to object, Senator Chambers, and I appreciate your point of view.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called for. And Senator Dickinson, I presume you have asked unanimous consent to withdraw your motion, is that correct? He says yes. Senator Kime, did you wish to speak.

SENATOR KIME: I just wanted to ask a question of Senator Luedtke.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke do you yield?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, sir.

SENATOR KIME: Well now this bail bond that you describe. What does this man charged for, or what, or does it pay larceny or felony. Or what is..

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Anything, anything that he is bailable. You know what is not bailable. Very few crimes that are.

SENATOR KIME: First degree murder.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: So everything else is bailable. So it applies to everything lese.

PRESIDENT: Any other discussion. If not we are ready to advance the bill. Those in favor of LB 828 vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.
