PRESIDENT: The bill having failed to receive a sufficient number of votes to be in the primary election, we shall now vote upon it, which requires 30 votes for it to be in the general election. Those in favor as a bill vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Voting aye 37, voting nay 9, voting not, 3. (Printed on pages 807 and 808 in Journal)

PRESIDENT: LB 1034 is passed. Next bill is LB 1036. With emergency clause.

CLERK: LB 1036. With Emergency (read)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is 'Shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached?' Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: Voting aye 48, voting nay 0, not voting 1. (Printed on page 808 of Journal)

PRESIDENT: The bill passes with the emergency clause attached. The Chair wishes to recognize Senator Mahoney, and he's going to be introducing a speaker pro tem of the Indiana Legislature. Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, as Chairman of the Nebraska Intergovernmental Relations Committee. It gives me great pleasure this morning to introduce not only the speaker pro tem of the Indiana Legislature, but the Chairman of the Council of State Governments who is present with us today making his annual inspection of the Legislatures. And Nebraska happens to be first on the list. He has just completed their session last week in Indiana.
