PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. I move that this bill be introduced also.

PRESIDENT: Those in favor of introducing the bill, vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, no nays, 16 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is introduced. Are there any other bills to introduce.

CLERK: Yes. Mr. President, I move for the introduction of the attached bill. (Signed) Senator Kennedy. It's signed by the members of the Health and Welfare Committee. A bill for an act to adopt the emergency medical services act. to provide for the regulation of ambulances and ambulance's attendants.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: Mr. President, and fellow members, I move to introduce this bill. We've done considerable work on it. We've contacted other states, seeing what they have done on this. This is one of the emergency federal road acts, and I would like to have it introduced and have a hearing next Tuesday on it, if possible. I hope that we can introduce this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carstens.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to ask Senator Kennedy a question, if he will yield?

SENATOR KENNEDY: Yes, certainly.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Senator Kennedy is this the bill that there was a hearing held before the introduction or the discussion of the bill. Is this the same bill?

SENATOR KENNEDY: No, we have not had a hearing. We have not had a bill. This is the bill that has been drawn by the volunteer ambulance, firemen, a group of people that they've considered. And we would like to have a public hearing on it and we have did a lot of work on it. This is not the original bill.

SENATOR CARSTENS: O.K. Thank you.

SENATOR KENNEDY: I move the introduction.

PRESIDENT: Those in favor of introducing this bill, vote aye those opposed vote no. Senator Duis did you have a question on this bill?

SENATOR DUIS: Yes, if I may. I just wanted to follow up the previous question. This has no connection at all, then with the bill that I previously had heard that the volunteer firemen
