lobbyists are doing anything illegal. I think it's beholden upon this Body to make it absolutely clear what is expected or not expected of the lobbyists. The real problem is not the strength of the lobbyist. The real problem is the weakness that the Senate must work in, the constraints we must work in because of the Constitution and the few working days. The fact that most people don't understand what's going on in government, the fact that there is no pay so that you consequently get very little work. It amazes me that some senators are so dedicated that they serve and will serve down here year in and year out. I think the real problem before us is not the strength of the lobbyists but the weakness of the little man in this state, thinking that he is serving himself when he keeps the Senate down and he says, aw, here's my chance to give those bugs a shot. Bang, there goes your pay raise. We're going to keep you in constraints and that little man....that little farmer....is cutting his own throat from ear to ear.
