

the two bills, but there is no relationship between the two off or rather two of them Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Alright, Senator Kremer, can you answer this question, are these bills the same or are they different?

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman and as I understand it there are some similarities. This bill 826 has to do with the manufacturing of the trailer homes, and it does provide that there does have to be built into the homes a tie down arrangement so that you can do this, tie down the trailer home. As I understand it, Senator Simpson does have an amendment that has to do with the method of tying it down or that there has to be an installation in the concrete floor where they rest that would provide that they have to be tied down. So there is a little relationship there but, Senator Burbach's bill has to do with the manufacturing and provides for the facility of tying it down. Is this right Senator Burbach?

SENATOR BURBACH: The main purpose of this bill, so we don't have uninspected mobile homes. This is the wiring, the installation, and the entire structure of a mobile home, must pass the inspection of the state health department. This does not say that they must be tied down. This is a different bill. I do believe that in the case of the other bill, we have that portion on the books already. I don't want to get into that but I am certain that we do have that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Senator Burbach, I think that you have got a better bill than the other one, I'm not disagreeing with that, what I am saying is that if there is an amendment available, the gentleman that has it, Senator Simpson is not in here, he is at an appropriations, can we ask for unanimous consent on Select File at this point because he is not in here? How do we do that so that he can have the opportunity to amend it before this body if he so chooses? I think that should be reserved these people because they can't be in here. The I would move the objection, and let the bill go ahead.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Let me say, I happen to have an installation of 160 spaces to park mobile homes on. Now Senator Simpson's amendment as I understand it, only has to do with the securing by the putting into the concrete or some other area, bolts for example which support the trailer by chains which are attached from the bottom of the trailer until the bolts. It is to be done only from the standpoint of wind resistance where you have high winds, which means all of the time. Now the only question I know about this bill is that Senator Simpson requests for example that they be approved by the director of motor vehicles. Now there are other people who desire that it be approved by the Public Health department which is a nominal thing that really doesn't make any difference. I don't think that they have any particular connection and I would certainly believe that this body, if Senator Simpson felt that they did have that we would do the same thing for him as that we would do for this bill.

SENATOR BARNETT: That is my big question, if he has an amendment to offer, can we adopt it by unanimous consent on Select File, this has been done before, many times in here. We have given consideration to these people who can't be here.
