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continue to say we want state aid and we want more homestead exemptions and we want that and we want this other and I support many of those, you have to plug in the money to pay for it. The cost of those programs start July 1, 1974 and we will have 11% unless you make a difference. And we will have 11% in July, August, September, October, November and December. Then to recoup the necessary money to pay for those programs that you've going to vote in this budget document, you've got to do that in January, February, March, April and June of the next year. And to make up the necessary money in that 6 months, it's not a question now of raising \$9 million dollars with 1% increase in the income tax. It's a question now of raising \$9 million dollars and you have a half year to do it. So to raise the \$18 million dollars, you have to go up 4% next year because you're only using a half year to collect the revenue. And, listen carefully, when that 4% goes up to collect that money, you have made a change in the structure so that now you have more money coming in from income tax than you have from sales tax. And, then you have to make that adjustment at that point. And so what the people of this state are going to get from you people that said no tax rates now, they're going to get not only an increase in income tax come next January, they're going to get an increase in the sales tax from you. But bear in mind those are back are going to be safe because you have plodded through this year and you've told the people you're for more programs at a cheaper cost. And they're going to have less taxes. And then come January they're going to have more taxes. Now, those that want 11%, those that want 11%, Senator Duis if you'd like to talk, you can punch your light. Now, those that want 11%, if they really mean that, then they can stop pushing for some of the programs.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis, could you bring this to a conclusion, please?

SENATOR LEWIS: It's up to you, it doesn't make any difference but I have a motion to go on Senator Stahmer's bill that we do this November 1 and then we'll separate the sheep from the goats.

PRESIDENT: And, now, Senator Marvel will close on the motion to indefinitely postpone LB597. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: It'll take a moment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Sometime today or tomorrow, I've been requested to make a motion that when we adjourn tomorrow, tomorrow, we adjourn until Monday until 9:00 o'clock...the following Monday at 9:00 o'clock. I hope between now and then you'll give it some thought what you want to do. Now, the reason for that, the Budget Committee is still has problems. They're trying to save legislative days. We were going to try and adjourn today but there are other problems because the Lieutenant Governor will not be here until tomorrow, he can't sign some of these bills. But beyond that, there's no reason that I can see that we can't adjourn Thursday night until the following Monday at 9:00 o'clock.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Marvel, will you then close?

SENATOR MARVEL: In conclusion, I would like to say this, members of the Budget Committee, Legislature, Mr. President, if there's any game being played, it's very simple. If we
