SENATOR GOODRICH: Get that guy on the ball. I cleared this with Senator Richendifer and I have his okay.

PRESIDENT: It will take 25 votes on Select File. Those in favor of the amendments vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye. Have you all voted? We need 25 votes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Wait a minute, we need one more green vote. I don't want to go for a call of the house if we can have one more green vote.

PRESIDENT: Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, one nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move LB813 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance the bill. Those in favor of advancing the bill say aye. Those opposed no. The bill's advanced.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the adoption of LB641.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, the amendment on LB641 is Senator Kremer's specific amendment for which the bill was returned this morning. The motion now is to adopt the Kremer amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I move the amendment be adopted. As I explained this morning....I'll just make a brief statement. It does require that the natural resource district pay their fair share of the cost of putting the names of those running for office on the ballot.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich, did you....any discussion? If not, those in favor of the Kremer amendment vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Senator Whitney voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Whitney voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Clerk will record. Excuse me, just a minute.

CLERK: 27 ayes, no nays, 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. What'll you do with the bill, Senator Kremer? Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Move LB641 be advanced to E & R for Engrossing as amended.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance the bill. Those in favor vote aye. Opposed no. Bill's advanced. This takes care of Select File. Any other reports on the desk? Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: A point of order. Is this situation going to prevail tomorrow as well? What I mean, are we going to be short members tomorrow like we are.....

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.
