PRESIDENT: Well, this took place before our rule, certainly. Senator Kremer go ahead.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, this is not at the request of the Governor. The suggestions for this bill was brought to the committee by Senator Warner, and I'm sure that Senator Warner is ready to go with the bill, and explain it. There are no amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members. LB976 merely came about because we have had repeatedly over the years since I've been here legislation introduced and numerous studies looking at how we could provide some of the inspections as well as the by various agencies, and reduce the duplication of the car and inspectors of some particular business, and it seems to me that every legislative study has resulted in those agencies that had the inspection responsibilities of pointing out why results of a interim study wouldn't work. Last session we had LB 50, if I remember correctly, this by a study committee chaired by Senator Duis, in which a great deal of time was spent. Again it was pointed out it wouldn't work, so a suggestion that I made well, since the legislature can never come about with a plan that is acceptable, we will pass a bill directing the governor who the code agencies that do this are directly under him to come in with some kind of a proposal. Present it to a legislative committee prior to the next session. So the Legislative, the interim study committee could look at, prior to the session and then perhaps resolve the issue that has been a constant one for a good many years. I would agree that there is no need for the bill, certainly the governor could go ahead and do that on his own, if he so chose, but it seems to me as long as this issue has been around since our legislative studies has generally not been acceptable to the executive side, let's direct them to make one and see if they can suggest ways and means to reduce the number of people running around making inspections and perhaps provide some greater efficiency in this area.

PRESIDENT: Any others wishing to speak on LB976? If not what do you do with the bill?

SENATOR WARNER: I move the bill be advanced to E & R.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor then of advancing LB 976 to E & R Initial vote aye, opposed vote nay. Voting aye, Mr. Clerk. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, no nays, Mr. President, on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: LB 976 is advanced. Mr. Warner, are you ready for the next bill.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, I was going to ask unanimous consent to take up one of Senator Waldron's bills, I think carried he mention to you yesterday, 57. It deals with contracts with teachers, but it's essentially to correct some legislation that was in effect last time. There are some controversy in the bill which has been taken out, by an amendment to be attempted to be put back in Select File. But if we could at least get it started.
