SENATOR WHITNEY: It could be amended, yes. I think it could be amended out. What county was involved?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Pardon.

SENATOR WHITNEY: What county?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Cass.

SENATOR WHITNEY: From what district, to what district?

SENATOR CARSTENS: They are now in 6, but would like to be in 5.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I see no objections to the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Then, I would have to draft an amendment to that affect.

PRESIDENT: We have three others wishing to speak. Senator Moylan, Senator Kelly, and Senator Richard Lewis in that order. Senator Moylan.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I think this bill has just been reported out to General File. Just lately and it has a voluminous amendments on it. I believe it should be held over until the full chamber is here.

PRESIDENT: I take you are objecting to taking it up.

SENATOR MOYLAN: Give us more time to study these amendments, yes.

PRESIDENT: So you object to taking it up.

SENATOR MOYLAN: I object to taking it up at this time. I ask that it be laid over.

PRESIDENT: With that then, it will be under our rules this afternoon. It will be laid over. Passed over. Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to ask unanimous consent that it be brought up next Tuesday.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Whitney is asking unanimous consent that LB30? be placed for debate on General File Tuesday. What is that, March 5, Tuesday. Is there any objection? Senator Kelly?

SENATOR KELLY: A question of Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I yield.

SENATOR KELLY: After eighteen months or two years, why the rush, Senator Whitney?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Oh, if you want to set it for a week later, that's fine with me, Senator Kelly. I just don't want it to be lost out of the ... a long ways down the list, and I don't want it to loose out.

SENATOR KELLY: Well, let's try it a week later, a week from Tuesday, if that suits you.
