PRESIDENT: Very good. Yes sir. Senator Duis, do you want to be heard? Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: I just merely wanted to say now the discussion can take place.

PRESIDENT: Check. Well, we're not on Select File, hold on, just a minute. Do we have Resolutions on the desk?

CLERK: Not at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there any bills for introduction?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: We're ready then for the consideration of the bills on Select File. Senator Stull.

CLERK: The first one, Mr. President, on Select File, is LB763. There are amendments pending by Senator Carpenter.

PRESIDENT: LB763? Senator Carpenter, LB763.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That's 721?

CLERK: No, LB763, isn't that? My apologies, LB721.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have talked to Senator who wanted more information from the Banking Department. I just talked to him a few minutes ago. He said he had all he wanted for the time being. He now had no personal objection to the bill being moved on from Select File to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Are you then withdrawing your amendments, Senator Carpenter?

SENATOR CARPENTER: No, I want the amendments to be adopted. At that particular time.....I move for the adoption of the amendments.

PRESIDENT: Thank you.

SENATOR CARPENTER: They were discussed at that time and there was no opposition as I understood at that time. The senator from the western part of Nebraska wanted more information. Since that time he's had a conference with Mr. Ley, the Banking Commissioner, and for the time being at least he's satisfied. I move for the adoption of the amendments.

CLERK: Mr. President, his amendments are found on page 763 and 814 of the Legislative Journal. Page 763 and 814.

PRESIDENT: We're looking then at Senator Carpenter's amendments to LB721 on Select File. Clerk has already advised you they're found on page 763 and 814. The amendments are extensive.

CLERK: Well, the sections are long. The changes are very minor.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

SENATOR CARPENTER: The Clerk read the new and the stricken matter.

CLERK: Okay, in section 1.....

SENATOR CARPENTER: Okay, let me say to the Body now. The main reason for this was to prevent another state bank being
