reducing materially the insured needs for the equalization fund? Which is in the Duis amendment whereas the Duis amendment had it \$1,200 per pupil in the 9th to 12th grade. You're reducing that to \$900? Is that correct?

SENATOR WARNER: That would be correct.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well, then, I move that we divide the question, that we take this up separately, this particular one of the amendments separately because I'm definitely opposed to this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: If Senator Whitney would like to vote on the first....Vince.....that was the first amendment.....

PRESIDENT: The first amendment would be found on page 800. Right.

SENATOR WARNER: If we could vote on that one separate, if we could adopt the other ones, then we can discuss that one. That's fine.

SENATOR WHITNEY: May I ask Senator Warner another question?

PRESIDENT: Does Senator Warner yield to another question?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Warner, could we just, could I just move to strike that sub-section 4 and take care of what I have in mind without interfering with the rest of it.

SENATOR WARNER: No, no, what you'd want to do, Senator Whitney, is to and I assume insert \$1,200 instead of \$900 in that amendment.....

SENATOR WHITNEY: Yes, and then also keep the others.

SENATOR WARNER: (inaudible) then the drafting will be messed up.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well, then, I'd like to know in what way will the drafting be messed up.

SENATOR WARNER: If you just entirely strike it, the provisions in the other portions already strike the Carpenter amendment on the 27th, see, there would be no insured needs at all if you drafted it....if you struck it entirely, Senator Whitney. What you would like to offer is an adjustment in those figures which you could make as an amendment to this one.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well, Senator Warner, isn't that already in the bill to have \$1,200 for the insured need for grades 9-12. Isn't that already in the bill?

SENATOR WARNER: Not in a workable manner that's consistent with the rest of the bill, Senator Whitney, but you can amend this to accomplish the same thing. We're talking about drafting so the bill was, is consistent throughout.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Well, could we discuss the other amendments first? I'd like to move to divide the question at the moment and then I'd like to put in an amendment to re-insert what Senator Duis had in reference to the insured needs. And I'd like to make that as an amendment and have it up there as quick as I can get it.
