

right at the moment under the present conditions we've killed the bill this session and I think it should stay dead this session and next session if we can work something out some way, some place, why, I'm not saying I can or can't, I'm merely saying there's some changes possibly in the school board and maybe we can all the districts in this Legislature get in the swim in '75 and Senator Chambers will be here in '75. Well, maybe we can work something out. I think it would be bad to keep running this through the session....I mean the same session time and time again.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I merely wanted to explain further on the committee report. Perhaps it's been explained but the committee did adopt the amendments offered by Senator Chambers included Class 3's and 5's as well as Class 4 and after this was done, why, the motion then definitely....to indefinitely postpone was made and this carried, I think, the sentiment of the committee was two or three things. One certainly was that the issue had been discussed to some length. Perhaps should not be brought up again this session. Another problem was there were those who objected to the expansion of the three, particularly the Class 3. There were those that...but between the expansion of the amendments together with the fact that the bill, the proposal had been discussed before the committee had been indefinitely postponed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I think Senator Syas made an important point in that the bill as it would come out would deal only with the City of Lincoln. As a Lincoln resident and Lincoln senator, I think we should have our chance to have our needs and our educational needs discussed on this floor. The Lincoln school board elections are set in off years so that if we were to consider this bill next year, Senator Syas has suggested, it would not take effect in time for the election which would be in the spring of '75. So for the community of Lincoln, I think it would be important that this bill be raised and considered this year so that for next year's school board elections, things could be planned and considered for district election. I would support Senator Chambers' move.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, Senator Chambers, you may close.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No closing.

PRESIDENT: Are you ready for the vote? The motion is to bring the bill out of committee despite the actions of the committee. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? I'll hold it a minute, Senator Chambers. Counting. Are you satisfied? Not satisfied. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I'm going to ask for a call of the house and if it won't do any good for this bill, it may help for something that may come after this one.

PRESIDENT: I see five hands. I see five hands. I'll clear the board. All those in favor of a call of the house, vote....
