CLERK: Mr. President, a message from the Governor. Read message.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kremer and then Senator Schmit. The light is on, Senator Kremer. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. At this time all I'm going to say is that I'm disappointed, I did not move the bill lightly when I asked to have it advanced. I think the Legislature has spoken on the bill and that's all I have to say at this time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter and then Senator Kremer.

SENATOR CARPENTER: (Inaudible)

PRESIDENT: Is he turned on? Senator Carpenter, will you repeat what you just said? Senator Carpenter, she says she has you on here but I don't believe you're coming through. Did you depress your button?
