

available. Not use them for nine other reasons. I would have no objection to that, I'm not speaking for the executive board I'm only representing them. They may agree or they may disagree with my conclusion. Now when it comes to expenditures how in heavens name can anybody project or guess or visualize or dream what this body is going to spend, and what good will it do. You have got a board full of bills up there that require a lot of money. You have got 997 which is going to spend more money if I can be the reason for it than the bill calls for. If you are going to go into the appropriations the regular appropriation bill of this legislature, I'm not satisfied with it speaking only for myself. I'm not satisfied with the capital budget as it now exists or will exist. I don't think that it is adequate enough so how in heavens name can anyone guess that and do you any service. In so far as guessing at the revenues, I think that is a realistic request, I would not oppose that and I don't think that the staff should waste a lot of time guessing what this body is going to do when we don't even know our selves. So if the Senator is willing to agree to the projection and accept the projection based upon the information only available only as to revenues, I would certainly be the last one to oppose. But I would oppose using the fiscal staff for other reasons besides that of the information in order to put us all in an embarrassing position.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: I think that that is necessary to respond to, you see Mr. President, this is not a historical thing that I am asking for. In the report prepared for you by the fiscal staff, not only did they project income, the one that I presented to you the other day, they also projected anticipated expenditures. Now obviously SENator Carpenter is absolutely correct that this is not definitive at this point and that will be the dollar level that we will expend and I certainly think that you are entitled to know the accumulated expenditures a in the area of the general budget operation and they have projected those the last time that I talked and presented information to you and they said 282 million dollars. Now they what the budget information or recommendations are at this time. They also I am sure are aware of how much we have appropriated in terms of A bills. I'm sure that they can make some other necessary projections that we need to know in terms of revenue....expenditures, obviously this is not a new law but it is certainly a vantage point that you do not have at this present time in order to make some decisions. Again, it is not a president, they did the same thing to us the first of Janaury.
