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mind you, of raising extra money for taxes. He says taxes, of course, but that's only just a selling point. Primarily for the race track in South Sioux City and I'm opposed to that type of legislation. And I don't think we should start that precedent here.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB692. Now, Senator Cavanaugh, do you want to speak to the motion to indefinitely postpone?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I would oppose the motion to indefinitely postpone. I think Senator Murphy has run me around in circles as much as anybody else and all he's asking for is to allow horses to run around in circles in Sunday and I don't see any problem on that. I support Senator Murphy.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB692.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President and fellow members. I don't like to oppose my good friend, Senator Murphy. However, I think we have something that's sort of historically, it's historical to Nebraska, to the United States, to keep this at least one day for rest. I'm sure horse racing on Sunday will lower the quality of our living. Most of our small towns don't allow the selling of liquor on Sunday. Probably beer in the morning but not in the afternoon and where we do allow it, we have a lowering of quality in the village or the town. And, there's one thing we must remember, that the building blocks of our Constitution are Christian principles.....

and when we vote on this, on the indefinitely postponing, I'm for that. I want a record vote so we know how we vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, next to speak, Senator Frank Lewis. This is the motion to indefinitely postpone LB692. Speaking only to that point.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: I rise to support my not so good friend, Senator Murphy, who voted wrong previously. The bill was well presented and I think that this a trend that a lot of states around us that horse racing has become involved in. And I think particularly a track like at South Sioux City it would be most helpful to them. And based what I know about Murphy already, I don't think they can be saved anyway. So I would suspect, there is merit to the bill. I think the committee had a full hearing on it. I think that's going to help that track and it's going to help the fine sport of horse racing and I would oppose Senator Waldron's motion to indefinitely postpone.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer. That's the motion to indefinitely postpone.
