SENATOR CARPENTER: I'd like to ask unanimous consent to take up LB984 which is on General File almost ahead of us. Now the reason is this, LB772 is now on E & R for Engrossing, that's state aid to local public schools. Senator Warner had a desire and the Body agrees to have LB984 take ahead of LB772 and be read in that order. LB772 is probably one of the most important single bills in this Legislature. And for that reason LB984 is the Governor's bill as I understand it in whole or part. It has to be passed, as I understand, ahead of LB772. For that purpose, I ask we take it up now and if it's off from General File, to expedite it.....I think Senator Warner is willing and able to explain it.

PRESIDENT: Well, Senator Carpenter, we've got a little problem here because we have LB957 still bracketed for today that hasn't been disposed of. I don't believe the Chair understood this anyway. Senator Schmit, may I have your attention please. What is your pleasure regarding LB957 because.....

PRESIDENT: One amendment to the bill then apparently offered by Senator Warner found on page....two amendments? Okay. Is there another amendment up here then?

CLERK: Yes, there's another amendment from Senator Warner. It's not printed in the Journal though.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Senator Warner, back to you.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President....Mr. Clerk, which amendment is not in the Journal? Is it a short one?

CLERK: The short one is not.....
