out of the reach of this habit to some form or to some degree. Nobody is safe. It's a know factor that these things, the sale of these things and the consumption, a large part of the known crime causes in this country from rape on down and up. And I can't stand still and not at least ask one member to support Senator in his move to override. Only because I think the need is there.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Proud. Speaker Proud. The motion is to override the Governor's veto on 77.

SENATOR PROUD: Well, I'm in favor of it. Of course he seems to think the Income Tax can be 13%, and I agree with him there. But I think that this drug problem is so serious that on this particular proposition he needs a good old fashion override.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, and members I certainly am in favor of overriding the veto. I..this is not political for me. I think there is a real need, and there is..I would be repeating and I would just like to say amen to what Senator Carpenter said. We do have the problem, the need, and let's meet the need and I think it's rather a poor place to be economizing.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I also rise to support the move to override the Governor's veto. We must keep in mind that we have approved the hiring of special legal counsel for the patrol in the area of drug and narcotics control and investigation and crack down. These investigators that were to be provided by LB77, 77A, were an adjunct, it's a hand in glove type operation. We need, and I say we, I mean the State of Nebraska, the State Patrol needs these people. I think it is very unfortunate that anyone who is interested in a..in real in a real crack down on drug controls in the State of Nebraska would veto a bill of this nature, for the amount of money that is involved because if we are really interested in law enforcement we will override this veto.

PRESIDENT: Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR FRANK LEWIS: Mr. Chairman as a member of this body that twice last year helped to override the Governor's veto, on similar motions it's with a great deal of sadness that I will not today support an override, on this or any other expenditure motion, or another A Bill, because everyone who spoke today spoke in concern of what we are doing, but again this is related back to what resources we have, and to those that available certainly in fiscal responsibility, either this or the hundred other cases that will be made on this floor, including the Vet. Science building, a hundred other cases, will be the same problem.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the motion? Are you all through discussing Senator Schmit's motion? Senator Schmit may close then. Senator Schmit is now closing on his motion. To override the Governor's veto.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no closing, Mr. President.
