Continuation of roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MARSH: Since I have just received the information that this will add to the state expenditures \$14 million, I vote no.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 24 nays, remainder not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails, LB801 will not be placed on General File. What other motions do we have on the desk?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson, for what purpose did you want to be recognized?

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. President, I rise to a point of personal privilege.

PRESIDENT: State your point, Senator.

SENATOR DICKINSON: I think we have a unique situation. Thank you. I think we have a unique situation in the Legislature today if my information is correct. This is a special day for Lieutenant Governor and Shirley Marsh on the occasion of their 31st wedding anniversary. I want to offer my congratulations.

PRESIDENT: Well, thank you. I'm overwhelmed. It's very special of you, Senator, and I...we appreciate your sentiments. A fellow that can last that long can't be all bad. All right, we have 13 members of the junior class from Brownell-Talbott School in Omaha. Are they up there in the balcony? All right, very good. They're in the north balcony. They're from Senator Moylan's district. Senator Moylan, you'd better wave your hand up there to those children. Very good, all right, we're glad to have you here today as spectators to the Nebraska Unicameral Legislature. We hope you enjoy your visit to one of the architectural achievements of the world, still ranking, and also to the only Unicameral Legislature in these United States. Very good. What other motions do we have on the desk? Stand by.

PRESIDENT: All right, when we move back to General File.... no other motions on the desk....no unfinished business. We have the unfinished business of LB984 that we were discussing yesterday and were in the middle when we adjourned. Stand by just a minute here. Well, we have LB995 bracketed for today. But actually we have the unfinished business of LB984. I think we'd better tackle that first. Unless there's some change of the agenda out there on the floor. Let's go back to the discussion of LB984 where we left off yesterday. I think we were discussing Whitney's....Senator Whitney's original amendment. At that time a different amendment that he had tried had failed. Let's have the Clerk bring us up to date on that. Put LB984 up on the board and we'll go from there.
