

CLERK: Senator Wiltse voting nay.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh, is that voting yes on the original?

CLERK: Senator Maresh voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richard Lewis, is that yes on the original?

CLERK: Senator Richard Lewis voting aye.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Stahmer, what is it?

SENATOR STAHMER: Who were the three who were excused?

PRESIDENT: Senator Skarda, Johnson and Chambers are absent. Skarda is excused. Senator Anderson voting yes on the original? Senator Rasmussen yes on the original?

CLERK: Senator Rasmussen voting aye.

PRESIDENT: And Senator Anderson voting aye. Senator Stahmer.

CLERK: Senator Cal Carstens voting nay.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cal Carstens voting nay on the original. Senator Duis voting nay on the original.

CLERK: Senator Duis voting nay.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kime voting, what is it?

CLERK: Senator Kime voting.....

PRESIDENT: Aye? No on the original?

CLERK: Senator Stull voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull voting no on the original. Senator Luedtke voting aye on the original. Senator Whitney voting aye on the original. Senator Stromer voting no on the original.

CLERK: Senator Stromer voting no. Senator Waldron voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Waldron voting aye....on the original. Senator....wait, have you changed now....Senator Whitney changed from aye to no on the original. They moved that the Call be raised. Before we do that, Senator Keyes voting no on the original. Is that right?

CLERK: Senator Keyes voting nay.

PRESIDENT: They move that the Call be raised. Have you all voted? Tabulate the votes.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 12 nays, 14 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The Call has been raised. This is a record vote. Will you read the record vote.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, a roll call vote's been asked for. We'll take the roll. Senator, will you get in your seat, roll call vote. Senator Marvel.
