

reason that I question that is the fact that some large dealers and some large retailers can have cases and cases and cases of this stuff. \$10,000-\$15,000 orders are not uncommon in this business and I could name a few of the retailers in Omaha that actually place that kind of an order. The minute that you place a \$10,000 order 30 days to 6 weeks afterwards, you are in distress, so automatically you go to the cost price. That is how I arrived at the way of getting around the 15%. However, the bill does say technically speaking that it has 15%. It defines cost as the amount of cost on the invoice plus 15%. However, there is a loup-hole there that you could drive a tank through and get around that provision. That doesn't even bother me. The only thing that bothers me however, is the freight part of the bill striking 6, 7, and 8. Section 6, 7 and 8 of the bill and if you adopt this amendment I'll say lets put the bill on General reading or Final REading and pass it. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The motion is to adopt the Goodrich amendment. It will take 25 votes. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Voting on the Goodrich amendment. Have you all voted? The Chair would like to say that section seven has already been struck by a previous amendment. Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Since you have commented to the affect that Section seven had been striken, I thought that I had better point out that we are dealing with the white copy of the bill, not the green copy of the bill. There is a section seven there.

PRESIDENT: You will have to put that in your amendment then Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well the Clerk can specify on the amendment that this amendment applies to the white copy of the bill that is now the bill. This is the only....we instructed the staff to assemble the bill in its present form, applying all amendments so that we would know what we are dealing with. This is the bill, the white copy of the bill that has been distributed is the one we were dealing with right now, and there is a section seven in the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich is that the one that says January 29th, at the top of the page?

SENATOR GOODRICH: March 1st on the cover sheet. It says LB616, March 1, 1974. This is an unofficial copy of LB616 with all amendments incorporated.

PRESIDENT: OK, that takes care of it then. There is a question about it by a member of the legislature. Have you all voted? This is to adopt the Goodrich amendment to LB616. The question has already been asked. Now it is just a matter of according to votes. Senator Goodrich did you wish a call of the house?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No.

PRESIDENT: OK, Clerk will record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 19 nays and 18 not voting.
