

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays and 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is placed on 629. Any other amendments?

CLERK: None, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We are ready to advance the bill. Senator Keyes do you want to advance the bill?

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I move the bill be advanced.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance 629 to E & R engrossing we have a voice vote. Say aye, those opposed say no. If it has been returned for specific amendment then it has to have 25 votes to return it. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Please pay attention to voting. This is to advance 629, from select file. Senator Keyes is voting for a call of the house. Waiting for one more vote. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays and 22 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. The Chair recognizes Senator C. Carsten for a point of personal privilege.

SENATOR C. CARSTEN: Mr. President, are you through with Select File now?

PRESIDENT: Yes.
