

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, that is part of the the....that is in the computerized....

CLERK: NO it is not, it is a separate typed sheet. You should adopt those.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well I would move then....that is correct, these are technical amendments and I would move to have those adopted. They are nothing but technical amendments but I would move to have those adopted. They are nothing but technical amendments. Then we will get to Senator DeCamp's.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion is to adopt the..."technical amendment" as explained by Senator Luedtke found on page 531 of the Journal. All those in favor say aye, those opposed? Amendments are adopted. Just a minute Senator Luedtke, Senator Stahmer, your light is on. Did you wish to speak to this amendment on page 531 of the Journal? Alright, do you want to speak on the bill? Alright. Senator Luedtke back to you for the amendments found on page....Senator Luedtke back to you.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: These are the amendments.

PRESIDENT: These are the DeCamp amendments. Page 940 and the Chair will recognize Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, these are just some additional technical amendments that were needed to reach a compromise on the part of various people that would have an interest in this, including the press and including various attorneys so on and so forth. They provide for example the number of publications, they provide for when a person who would have an interest in a will when the date is measured for this interest. Things like this. And there is no disagreement to the best of my knowledge on any of them and I would move their adoption.

PRESIDENT: Those in favor of the amendments, say aye, opposed. Senator Carstens, just a moment please before we adopt the amendments. Senator Carstens, you want to speak on this amendment?

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, I'd like to ask some questions. Now, we call these technical amendments. Now, Senator DeCamp, what do you mean by technical amendments, what does it do in regard to publication, for example?

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, it changes the number of publications in some cases, and in other cases it makes certain that there is publication both for creditors notice and additionally probate notice. It's...as I understand these amendments might even be offered on your bill. I thought you were supporting them, that was my understanding.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The reason I want to ask about is who requested these amendments?

SENATOR DECAMP: Who requested them? The request came from a variety of sources, but primarily the news media, the out state newspapers, some attorneys.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The Press Association would not support 354 unless these were put back in, is that correct?
