PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh would you like to talk on this issue?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I think I would also oppose laying the bill over. I think that everyone should have been prepared and probably is prepared to discuss the merits today, and I was not here this morning. I don't know how detailed the discussion of the bill was. If the discussion was inadequately detailed this morning, I think we should pursue it this afternoon and get all the questions out and answered. And those that aren't satisfactorily answered, people can make their decision on the basis of that this afternoon. I don't see any benefit to laying it over until Monday.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carstens did you want to talk on this again?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Yes, what's before the house? My amendment?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter's motion to lay this over until Monday morning.

PRESIDENT. Senator Stull.

SENATOR STULL: We had an amendment pending of Senator Carstens, and then Senator Luedtke ended that. I think that has to be decided before any other amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stull, I believe that we decided that the motion to lay until Monday morning takes precedence over the proposed amendment. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my motion. And I now have on the Clerk's desk another motion to indefinitely postpone the bill.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections to Senator Carpenter withdrawing his motion to hold over until Monday morning? If not, so ordered. The motion to indefinitely postpone will not yield to Senator Carstens motion to amend. So we will continue the debate on that motion.

CLERK: So now the motion before the house is Senator Luedtke's motion to amend the Fred Carstens amendment to strike 8 and insert 6.

SENATOR CARSTENS: Let's vote on the amendment. Then you can put in your motion, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: My amendment was 7 to 6.

CLERK: Was 8 to 6. 78 to 76.
