SENATOR DICKINSON: I withdraw my objections.

PRESIDENT: There are no objections, so 932 and 933.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to consider all salary bills at the time the first one is considered on General File. (Signed) Senator Carpenter. I ask unanimous consent to consider all salary bills pending on General File at the time that the first comes on General File.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: There are a number of bills pertaining to salaries, above that of the average employee. There are more than one bill, and the purpose of the motion is, that when we come to the first one, then the Clerk automatically brings the rest of them up in the sequence, so one follows the other, so this body then will have an opportunity to make a determination what we want to do on all of them at the same time, or about the same time, rather than have an intervening period of time in which we might not have a continuity of thoughts. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson. This is a unanimous consent motion that all salaried bills be considered when the first one comes up on General File, is that correct Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: Any objections?

SENATOR CARPENTER: When we come to the first one, and then after that, the Clerk will bring the rest of them so they are..one follows the other, so we will have all the salary increases above the average employee before us at one time, so we can make a collective judgement on all of them, rather than separating them over a period of time.

PRESIDENT: If there are no objections. So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous
