PRESIDENT: There are no objections. So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to expedite LB354 and LB755 in that order. Signed, Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I so move. That's what I made in the first motion but I don't presume the Clerk caught it.

CLERK: I caught it but it was tied in with another motion.

PRESIDENT: Are there any objections to expediting LB354 and LB755?

SENATOR CARPENTER: In that order.

PRESIDENT: In that order. If not, so ordered.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, Mr. President, one further thing, and I'll be through with my self appointed duties. Yesterday I called to your attention as to whether or not today he would make some type of vote on the board indicating how many will be here tomorrow afternoon. It would seem to me we ought to have at least 30 if we're going to have a working number. I hope we'll not have any debate on it because certainly you know what you want to do in that area without any particular advice from anybody. So I move the question, Mr. President, the point those who will be here tomorrow afternoon will so state on the board.

PRESIDENT: Senator Richendifer.

SENATOR RICHENDIFER: This doesn't look as if it's an opportune time, Mr. Chairman, because they're scattered all over the Capitol building here to take a vote right here. We should have taken a vote right after lunch.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, if we do take a vote, I suggest we have a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter, do you wish to have a Call of the House first?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Call of the....all I'm trying to do is to determine who will be here. If we're not going to have enough here, let's adjourn today and come back Monday at 10:00 o'clock.

PRESIDENT: Call of the House has been asked for. Those in favor of calling the house, vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Voting aye. Please record your presence. We're voting to call under call. Yes, record the vote. Now, record your presence. Please record your presence so that the Sergeant at Arms can tell who's absent. Has everybody recorded their presence who's in the room? Clerk will record who are here. Senator Maresh, did you wish to say something? Senator Maresh is here. Senator Kremer is here. Senator Stahmer is here. Senator Kime has arrived. Your light's on, Senator Johnson, did you wish to say something? Everyone's here who has not been excused except Senator Luedtke. At this moment, I'm going to ask that everybody register a green vote in case you can be here Friday. Please register your intent. Senator Stahmer, push my button, please.
