PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Move LB995 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance LB995. Those in favor say aye. Opposed say no. The bill's advanced. Next bill's 826A.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Move LB826A be advanced to E & R for Engrossing.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance...826A. Those in favor say aye. Those opposed say no. The bill's advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB629 on E & R Final, signed, Senator Snyder.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNYDER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I had a call this morning. There is an opinion that there are conflicting sections in this bill and I'm awaiting another phone call to get more details on this but I ask unanimous consent to bracket it just for today probably.

PRESIDENT: Any objections? So ordered. Anything else on the desk? Any motions to reconsider?

CLERK: Mr. President, your committee on Revenue to whom LB959 instructs me to report the same advanced to General File, signed, Senator Burbach.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer. Senator Stahmer, did you have ...wish to speak?

SENATOR STAHMER: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Body. I ask unanimous consent to bracket LB922 on E & R Engrossing. I've talked to Senator Luedtke. This is his bill and I'd like to have it stay it there for....LB922....for the consideration of a possible amendment and this is...has the approval of the sponsor so I ask unanimous consent. I'll send the note down.

PRESIDENT: Any objections? LB922 is bracketed. Any motions to reconsider? Motions to advance bills from committee?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Any other pending motions?

CLERK: Nothing, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Any unfinished business?
