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(knowingly) and don't notify the sheriff within 36 hours, you're liable for punishment. That is knowingly. And I don't think folks know this and I've talked to my sheriff about it that I'd wish you'd run an ad in my local paper letting folks know about the fundamental brand laws. We'd have a lot less trouble losing livestock if they knew the laws so I'm hoping they could use some of this money probably to run once a year an ad in our county papers to show the very fundamental brand laws of when they are.... when they have a stray critter what the....action they should take....and if they don't, what the penalties are.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson, now, it's Senator Nore, Anderson, Johnson and Senator Kime. And will you turn off your lights, all four of you.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, I wonder if Senator Stull would yield to a couple of questions? Senator Stull, you've had a chance to visit with Mr. Beermann about this, so you may have some information that I have not had a chance to check out. But I was talking just yesterday with a member of the Brand Committee who lives in my district and he indicated that there was a bill going through here now that would raise the inspection fee from 25¢ to 35¢ I believe. Do you know anything about this?

SENATOR STULL: Yes, sir. There is, I think Senator Epke is the sponsor of that bill, and I would prefer that he would ask....answer any questions that you have.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Senator Epke, could you comment on that, please?

PRESIDENT: Just a minute, I have Mrs. Ione Hector of Lincoln, Kellogg Elementary School, 25 students, from Senator Barnett's district. Will you stand please? Doesn't say where they're located but I assume they're in the north balcony. Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Okay, I was just asking...asking for some information on...and what I understood was....

PRESIDENT: Senator Epke?

SENATOR ANDERSON: Of Senator Epke, yes sir.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Epke, do you yield?

SENATOR EPKE: I yield.

SENATOR ANDERSON: This correct, Senator.

SENATOR EPKE: This is correct, Senator Anderson, in fact I've got two bills to tie together. One of them is LB935 and that sets up a procedure where they can have a registered feed lot within the brand area. This, of course, will cost possibly some revenue that they're taking in under the present brand inspection and then the next bill LB935, it merely changes the existing brand law so that this registered feed lot law ties into the brand laws. And also raises the fee to 35¢. Now, that's the maximum, they don't have to charge the 35¢. They have a maximum of 25¢ now. They don't feel at the present time they want to go up to the maximum of 35¢ because they're
